the-scenes work to maintain and enhance the Guild's public image through media relations.


John Close – for his consistent initiative in taking on new projects and his friendly encouragement of newer members.

CARVING for beginners and/or advanced by David Southern, commencing Monday January 19. Book yourself in on 5335 8323.


CABRIOLE LEGS off the bandsaw by John Phipps – sounds interesting! Attendance is limited to six. Phone 5450 1504.
