

#### **Open Day**

It also relies on your contribution in either demonstration time, donations or items for display and sale. We need your help, regardless of your experience as a woodworker and how long you have been in the club.

A set of guidelines and instructions offers first time or newer members a glimpse of how things happen and provides them a chance to get involved. Copies of the guidelines are with the Organising Committee or available from Rick Vickers, (5494 3555) the Event Organiser for 2010.

Members are reminded to fill in the volunteer sheets (on the cork notice board) for the various and many activities. If you are new to this event, there are plenty of 'mentors' to guide you. Don't allow inexperience to restrict your involvement.

All rostered members are requested to arrive by 8:30am, so that the event can begin promptly. The key times for the OPEN DAY are:

- k. 3 pm OPEN DAY finishes

#### **Timber Flow and Storage Report**

Timber in the kiln was drying well due to the long spell of warm dry weather, but drying has slowed down during the recent wet weather.

A stack of Bunya Pine fresh from the Porta mill was added on top of the kiln load during the month. President Dave screwed down the restraining bolts to take up the shrinkage in the trolley loads at the same time. More air drying space under cover is badly needed to cope with the increased production of slabs and milled timber, and serious thought must be given to this problem. There is no point in producing quality, value-added timber to see it deteriorate under temporary cover in the yard. We bought two more old roller doors at a cheap price in January. We have found that these can be laid over stacks of slabs in the yard to provide better cover and weather protection. George Blowers brought them up from Nambour for us.

My work on the breaking-down dust extractor is now complete thanks to help from Harry Wood and John Holland. This now enables poorer quality slabs left in the racks to be milled to usable timber without a massive emission of dust. Does anyone feel like volunteering to assist with this?

The Guild has bought a large steel industrial storage rack, which will be used to replace the deteriorating wooden racks in the yard which we use for keeping lumps and pieces for the carvers and turners. The new racks will provide better display and storage of the pieces, allowing much easier access and use by members.

Ray Curry and his helpers have worked the Porta mill twice during January and a trolley-load of a variety of slabs in various thicknesses is the good result of their efforts.

#### **Scroll Saw and Intarsia Group**

The scroll saw and intarsia course is progressing well with three meeting days attended by the enthusiastic group of "Woodies" who have already made some very presentable items. The course has covered basic scroll saw knowledge and skills with a simple wooden bowl. (Who said all bowls have to be turned.)

The bowl was made out of one piece of wood and with the help of a bobbin sander and expert finishing from Max, the finished article looks great. The second item was an intarsia picture of a cowboy boot, with great potential to sell at Tamworth or the Gympie Country muster! This exercise was to further develop scroll saw skills but using those skills to have a crack at a simple intarsia.



The third week found the group creating a jigsaw of a honey-eater in a flower. These can be mounted on a stand or left as a simple jigsaw. Another exercise in developing scroll saw skills.



The next project planned for week four (and five) will be a fairly large intarsia which will introduce the "band of scroll saw experts" in creating a three dimensional aspect to the piece.

The Scroll Saw Group, (Woodies Max, Steve, Lorraine, James and Roger) meet at John Muller's workshop on each Thursday at 9.00 where Woodie, Brian McTaggart has everyone hard at it. For \$20.00, morning tea, patterns and wood are provided.


