

#### **TIMBER FLOW & STORAGE MAY 2010**

The kiln was loaded last month with various woods including Red Apple, Rose gum, Camphor (shorts and slabs), large blocks of Silky oak, Silky slabs, and Jacaranda. As the year moves into dryer weather and sunny days, drying will become more efficient leading to shorter turn around times.

Good stocks of most used timbers including silky oak and camphor are now available in the racks, but don't feel reluctant to take part or all of a slab because someone might want to make a bar top out of it one day. The timber is slabbed and dried and stored for your use. Just ask the shed captain on the day to organise someone to cut the piece you need for you.

There is always a growing heap of reject wood and offcuts at the end of the yard near the toilets. Worth a look sometimes for carvers, turners and pen makers and it's free – the more you take the better – time to stock up on firewood too!

In the outside racks we have plenty of Red Bean, a rare item these days as it is a rainforest tree. It is dry and excellent for furniture. Be careful of the dust as you work it, wear a mask for this. A few big slabs of Queensland Maple remain, though it has worm damage in the sap wood, areas of good attractive grain remain in the centre.

Dennis Campbell has a friend who cuts and mills timber in New Guinea. He had some red cedar up there which he offered to freight to Proserpine free of charge at an attractive cost per cubic metre. Dennis offered it to the Guild and we decided to purchase one cube. It is ready milled in profiles of 150mm x 35mm and 150mm x 50mm and it is stored at Ray Currie's shed at Palmwoods. If you want some it is available at the Guild's usual red cedar price @ \$3000. (Less than half commercial rates!) It is not quite dry and we will include some in the next kiln loading. Thank you Dennis.

George Blowers is preparing to erect some steel racks in the yard which will greatly improve the storage capacity for lumps and pieces for turners and carvers, plus covered storage for freshly cut slabs and we will look forward to having this new facility. George spotted these industrial racks in a second hand yard and thought of us. Good on you George!






