

Hello fellow Woodies,

What a great time of the year! Winter is over, Spring is sprung, a new Committee is getting into the job and the retiring Committee is getting back to serious woodwork.

Under Dave Banister's gentle guidance over the last two years, the club has gone from strength to strength - in all areas. Much equipment has been replaced, facilities have been greatly improved at the Shed, many new members have joined up and we are in the best fi-

In a few weeks we will have a Hammer table saw to replace the Carba-Tec saw, that has proven to be unsuitable for our high levels of usage. There will be special accreditation requirements for the new saw, which we will advise about later.

Kiln and Timber Flow Report

The Kiln was unloaded on the 21st August by our dedicated kiln crew. Well done again guys! Warne Wilson and I were surprised that the timber moisture content was down to under 14% in such a short time. We then proceeded to load the kiln again and continued to load over the next two Saturday mornings.

Members will be pleased to know that some very good and hard to get timbers were placed in the kiln including White Beech, Hoop Pine, Red Cedar, London Plane Tree and New Zealand Karri. All of these were cut on the Lucas mill by George Blowers and his hard working team. We hope to have it all ready for use in about two months depending on the weather. There is also a good supply of our old favorite Camphor Laurel While I was out at the lucas mill site I took the opportunity to carry out a rough stock take, there is still a large amount of logs to be processed so the clubs supply is looking strong.

I will be organizing a working bee in the near future for the break down saw as we have a stock of dried slabs of various timbers that need to be cut into usable planks for members to use particularly the popular Camphor Laurel and Silky Oak

Storage of wood ready for sale is becoming a problem as our stock is steadily increasing so lets grab some well priced timber for that next project.

Take care of our precious machinery.....


The Committee has become concerned at members' reports over recent months that a few members are choosing to ignore common-sense rules designed to prolong the life of our machinery. There have also been reports of wilful abuse of our machines by those who know better.

Please be aware of our rules regarding machining of recycled timber. Used timber, particularly denser hardwoods, can cause accelerated wear on planer, jointer and saw blades. There is also a greater risk that imbedded nails etc will not be detected by our metal detectors and will cause expensive damage. If you are unaware of the expense involved in hitting a nail, bolt or piece of wire, talk to George Blowers, Ron Donald or your Treasurer who has to pay some of the bills.

The long-standing rule is that

- used timber, unpainted, is not to be machined on BRWG machines without the express permission of the Shed Captain of the day
- *no painted timber is to be machined at all.*

Regarding wilful abuse of machines, the Committee has reluctantly decided to take a firm line. If the Committee learns of cases of repeated abuse of BRWG machines, the member concerned will be warned, once only, and if the behavior continues, may be temporarily or permanently banned from that group of machines.



Club meetings on trial.....

For a six-month trial period, club business will be conducted at Committee meetings - short meetings (about 30 minutes) held every two weeks. Normally these will be attended by the President/Vice President, Secretary/ Assistant Secretary, Treasurer/Assistant Treasurer and at least one of the Shed Managers. Any member can attend as an observer, and specific club officers can be asked to attend to assist in their particular areas. However the elected Committee is legally responsible for managing the club's business, so they will ensure they understand members' views on the agenda items before attending each meeting, and they will make the decisions in the best interests of the club overall.

The club will hold General Meetings every three months to deal with more important matters that affect such things as the Guild's future, philosophy and constitution, for example. The first of these is planned for Thursday 11th November.


Decorating Turned Bowls - Demonstration

The demo will start at 9am & go for about an hour. If you have recently completed one of the turning courses now is your chance to see how to decorate your masterpieces.






