Ray and Ed have worked on several projects for 4 Paws which operates in conjunction with the Shire Pound at Sippy Downs.



Making a rocking chair safe for special needs Kids is quite a challenge and the design chosen for this project is a Rolling-Rocker with side skirts to prevent injury being caused to hands or fingers getting into the works under the chair.

Special bearings and fittings were needed to make it work. With the help of Caloundra Electrical and Bearing Agency, Dave Bannister overcame this hurdle and the Chair became a reality. Thanks go to Gary and Cheryle Campbell at Campbells Upholstery for the fine upholstery work that finishes off this chair to be presented to the Sunshine Coast Childrens Therapy Centre.

Developing Good Workshop Habits

To make a safe and pleasant working area please observe a few simple rules...

When you finish using a piece of machinery, clean up any off-cuts and mess left around the work area. If its a portable tool, reset it and put it away before moving on to the next part of your work.

Adjusting and Resetting Machinery

Here are some thoughts about considerate use of our machinery:

* Some members are adjusting machinery that simply doesn't need adjusting.

* If necessary adjustments have been made, then members should reset the machines appropriately.

For the pieces of machinery I have in mind, I would like to make the following observations:

* Bandsaws: the only adjustment you should ever make is to the height of the top guide.

* Jointers: you should only ever need to adjust either (i) the rise and fall on the infeed table or (ii) the width.

*****If you do feel that other changes are required, then

approach the Shed Captain or Shed Manager first.

Secondly, for some other items, where adjustments are more common, and when you have finished using these items, I suggest the following resetting:

- * For the combination saw:
 - set the angle back to 90°
 - the blade height to full
 - put the guard back if removed
 - set the sliding table angle back to 90°
- * For the sliding compound mitre (docking) saw:
 - set the angle back to 90°
 - the tilt to vertical
 - the height back to full cut.
- * For the thicknessers:
 - set the thickness back to around 25mm.

**Finally, don't try to force the machines.
Let the blades do the work.**

23/10 Headstock replaced on Jet 1442 lathe after new split pulleys and belt fitted.

27/10 No.2 Band Saw new blade fitted.

Re-sharpened blades fitted to 8" planer. The previous set were damaged.

Headstock of No.11 Lathe removed, belt slipping?

All three overhead Jet dust filters found to be not working. Max Barrenger investigated and found that a lightening strike had destroyed electronic components in each unit.

The Ryobi circular saw has burnt out. A repair or replacement is being investigated.

30/10 Max has successfully repaired two circuit boards of the dust filters, they are now working. The third one is beyond repair but will be made to work manually as replacing the circuit board is too expensive.

Both sliding pulleys of No.11 Lathe were lubricated and new belt fitted. Head now back on lathe bed.

03/11	New Makita 7 1/4 inch circular saw purchased.
