
LOCAL WOODIES HELP RESTORE OLD MAN'S LIFE

Members of the Blackall Range Woodcrafters Guild Inc located at the Montville Sportsground have restored two items of silky oak furniture retrieved from the floodwaters at Goodna recently. The pieces were among only a few possessions saved as the flood waters rose and consumed most of the life possessions of Mr John Knigge, a 74 year old man whose house was located in Enid Street Goodna. His two-storey house along with all others in the street and many others in Goodna was covered by the floodwaters over the roof. The muddy stinking waters consumed everything in their path leaving people homeless with few possessions.

The items were retrieved from the mud by volunteers who seeing their emotional value sought the help of the Woodies to give him back a small part of his life that had been washed away. The volunteers also retrieved and washed and oiled his tools so that he could at his convenience sought through them. A man who earned his living with his hands John was multi-skilled in a number of trades in steel and wood working and his range of tools was extensive across these areas. These included his wood turning lathe and range of chisels. John was rather philosophical about the loss. His grand-son remarked "Pop it's sad now, what are you going to do since your junk has been washed away?" In a rather matter-of-fact way John replied "It's alright son – "I'll just get some more."

"The items of furniture were in very poor condition and some of the sections of the cupboard had to be replaced as they were extensively damaged by the water. However they have scrubbed up pretty well. Silky oak is a very attractive and durable furniture timber" said Dave Banister who carried out much of the restoration work.

The restored furniture items were returned to John and his family this week. His daughter Tina Kennefick said John and his family were overwhelmed by the generosity of the volunteers who responded to their plight, some complete strangers until now. "The Builders Labourer's Federation have been wonderful with their members clearing out the debris, replacing internal linings and providing some whitegoods. Bell Scaffolding pulled men off the freeway job to erect scaffolding for the rebuild. Others gernied down the outside and underside of the building and recovered Pop's beloved tools. Others, total strangers, helped move mud and there were tons of that. Others maintained a steady flow of cold drinks and food to power the volunteers. People were fantastic. The restoration of these pieces shows people can help in all sorts of ways when others are in need.




In the first week of February someone tried to 'pull timber back' from the moving saw blade of the Wadkin Band Saw. This caused the blade to strike the door that covers the blade and in doing so destroyed the \$80 blade, folding many teeth back on themselves and breaking others off.

Because of the considerable damage done to the blade it would no longer cut wood so must have been noticed at the time. Someone of the restricted number of members, who are allowed to use this band saw caused this, and then left another member to discover the problem. This is a very disappointing situation that someone who has unfortunately caused accidental damage and then has not 'put his hand up', leaving others to carry the suspicion.



Please, Please, if you are in the unfortunate position of having caused damage to any of the club equipment, take the honourable course and tell the Shed Captain. There are no demerit points if you take this course of action. A section of the damaged band saw may be inspected at the Shed. -- Brian Harris, Shed Manager.

Timber Flow Report.

Hi All It's been a very quiet Christmas & New year period for kiln and timber flow: the wet weather has dampened everybody's enthusiasm, but on the 17th February, the Kiln was unloaded by myself and three hard working members of the kiln crew — Roman Berlak, Mike Poffley and Dave Edmond. There were some large pieces of Beech that had been lurking in there for six months because the moisture content will not go below 20%.

We also unloaded some Silky Oak, Mango, Camphor Laurel and Pine. The Mango slabs were substantial, being around three metres long and 400 to 500mm wide. It must have been a very old tree. If you want some, and who wouldn't, you will have to dig it out from under some very large slabs of Silky Oak.

The wood carving group is taking the bull by the horns and creating several purpose built carving benches out of some club hardwood, probably rose gum. The club is holding a quantity of hardwood of various species in the racks, so don't be afraid of working with it. Working with hardwood is tough going with hand tools, but power tools make the job a lot easier and the finish on some of these timbers is stunning.




