

Maintenance Report by John Isles

- <u>Carbatec 15" Thicknesser:</u> It was reported that this thicknesser was cutting as it should. Removing covers revealed that 10 cutter inserts had been destroyed. The way the cutters were destroyed would indicate that a piece of timber may have had a foreign object in it when passed through the cutters. Another possibility is that timber with several knots in was being thicknessed. The knots in timber will rise up above the timber surface which can cause problems with cutters such chipping, breaking or dulling the cutting edge of the cutters. The cost of these cutters is around \$8.00 each and this machine has 75 cutters.
- <u>Hammer Jointer</u>: Rotated the spiral head cutter inserts on this machine. The costs of these inserts is \$10.00 each and there are 47 inserts on this machine.
- <u>Gifkin Dovetail Kit:</u> Found the TGF5 finger joint router bit without the bearing. It can't be used without this bearing (see photo). Please report any damaged equipment to shed captain or manager so it can be replaced. Don't put it back in the box. Cost of new router \$60.00. So, the F5 finger jointer is out of action until a new router bit arrives. It has to come from NSW so who knows when that will be with Covid in NSW.



• <u>Workshop</u>: The standard of cleaning equipment after you use it has fallen over the past 6 weeks. So pick up your game and get back into the habit of cleaning the machine after you use it - this also includes the floor around the equipment. If you leave it the next person will leave it etc etc. For table saws and the panel saw - I would ask you to return the blade below the table before leaving the machine.

Some tips for using the Thicknessers.

- Check the piece of timber and see if it is concave or convex. A warped piece of timber really isn't suitable to put through the thicknesser. All the thicknesser will do is follow the contours of the timber.
- Use either of the jointers to flatten the piece of timber before putting timber through the thicknesser
- If it is a long piece of timber and you will be using short lengths, then cut the timber before using the jointer or thicknesser. It is much easier to be dealing with shorter lengths when jointing or thicknessing. It can also eliminate some of the concave and convex issues.
- Measure the piece of timber and find the thickest section and set the thicknesser to start at this height. If you find that the first pass doesn't remove much timber, then lower the cutting head a ½ a turn then put timber through again continue to do this until cutters are fully engaged across the timber. <u>DON'T LOWER THE CUTTING HEAD DOWN TO MEET THE TIMBER WHILE IT IS</u> <u>PASSING UNDER THE CUTTERS.</u>
- If you hear the thicknesser bogging down during its process, then re-evaluate the depth you are trying to remove. Try a shallower cut. Smaller cuts will give you a better finish and it is much easier on the cutters.
- If it is a thick piece of timber say 50mm+ and is warped, then consider using the Wood Wizz to flatten a surface before using the thicknesser. Remember if you are not accredited to use it then get yourself accredited.

Tips and Tricks by Woodworkers Journal. Edition 689





Here's a homemade steady rest system I've created for woodturning. I built it using the wheels and mounts from a pair of old in-line skates. I fashioned the articulated joints for each of the three rests from hardwood and bolts. They mount to my Excelsior mini lathe's bed using 150-lb breakaway Magswitch magnets I purchased from Rockler.



Once the rests are positioned and the magnets are turned on, tightening the bolts on the rests holds the wheels in place against a bowl or spindle. The system works great, and it can easily be retrofitted to any lathe.


