Keith has been working hard to get it all ready to go. So if you can come and help please come and join us.


Have a very happy Easter and stay safe.

Shed Managers' Report March 2024

Another reasonably quiet month on the maintenance front.

Maintenance:

The few minor items have been:

- The Jet Bandsaw got a new blade, after a routine breakage.
- The Laguna Bandsaw had some major attention when the lower back bearing was found to be seized. All bearings on the guides were replaced, and the machine fully adjusted.
- The Woodman No 1 table saw has a new riving knife fitted.
- Woodman No 2 table saw had some damage to the Jessem Guides.
- The final issue for this month has been stuff being left on overnight or over the weekend. We had the compressor and dehumidifier on twice, and the Jet filters once. Please check it is all quiet before closing up.

New Equipment

A bit of new equipment to talk about this month:

- The 235mm Makita power saw has been replaced, as the old one was beyond repair.
- The 75mm Makita belt sander has also been replaced. The old one had a bent frame, presumably from being dropped sometime in its life.
- The new 16inch Laguna thicknesser has had some teething problems with feeding material without skewing on the outfeed. We are attempting to resolve, but are not there yet. Please let us know if that happens to you.
- The new spindle on the Jessem Router lift is now fully operational. It has the same controls as the other Harvey router. Please see your Shed Captain if you are unsure of any of the controls.

Projects

We have a number of projects underway on upgrading BRWG facilities, and the following is a progress update for members.

• **WoodWiz Shed.** This has made real progress this month. We now have the roof on, the floor poured, and the walls partially complete. Remaining work consists mainly of the wall to the old shed to allow the Woodwiz to be weather protected.

Oils ain't Oils - A fiery warning when finishing with oils.

You may have heard that oily rags can self-combust. This is a real risk when working with many oils.

Finishing oils can be divided into two types: Hardening and non-hardening.

Hardening oils will penetrate a little way into the wood and then the surface will harden to form a fairly tough skin. Further applications will not penetrate but can resurface the skin. These are usually vegetable oils and are polyunsaturated oils.

Non-hardening oils will also penetrate a little way into the wood but the surface does not harden. These are usually paraffin/mineral oils and are saturated oils. They do not last as long and need more regular reapplication, especially on items like chopping boards.

Both types are food safe in their pure form but may have toxic additives so check the label.

The real problem lies with hardening oils. These polyunsaturated oils react with oxygen in a reaction which generates heat. This reaction cross links the oil molecules to give the hard surface but too much heat can be a real problem. When oily rags are packed together, enough heat can be generated to actually ignite the rags. There are numerous youtube videos on this such as https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9yq6VW-c2Ts

So what to do:

- To be on the safe side treat all oils as capable of igniting oily rags. This
 includes hardwax oils.
- When you finish a job, put the rags in a bucket of water.
- If you want to keep them. Wash them in water with a lot of detergent. Don't dry in a dryer as there may still be enough oil to ignite the rags in the hot air of the dryer. This has happened in industrial laundries when drying towels used for massages.
- The best option is to spread the wet rags out, away from anything combustible and, when dry, beat nature at its own game by burning them.
