Shed Managers' Report October 2024

A busy month, so a bit to report this month.

Maintenance:

The significant items have been:

- The Drum Sander seems to have settled down under the new locked regime, and members have adapted to the new arrangements. More importantly, the few times the drum has gotten a bit marked, have been reported. That is all we were really trying to achieve.
- Some minor blade breakage with the Jet bandsaw. This has had less issues with the blade coming off the wheels, so the message about not backing out on this machine must be getting through.
- Both the Hammer jointer thicknesser, and the 16inch Laguna have had cutters rotated, and should now be cutting much better. The Laguna in particular was making very heavy work of almost anything, so good to see it back to normal. We have also got the digital readout on this machine working again, but would ask (very strongly) that you only touch the bottom button briefly. Anything else messes up the calibration, with sort of defeats the purpose of having it.
- The discs on both sanders were changed, and are now a bit sharper. They were in a bad state.
- The Woodman No 1 table saw had its drive belts changed. This was in response to the safety incident referred to below. It now runs a fair bit smoother.
- The dust extraction system on the lathe area was out of action, but is now fixed, due mostly to some clever 3D printing by our Treasurer. You now can lift the lid and inspect the drum, and easily remove same. Neither of which were possible before.

Safety Issues

We had one significant issue this month, involving a kick back from the Woodman # 1 table saw. Contributing factors seem to have been the absence of the riving knife for that cut, and the machine vibration on run-down causing the cut piece to move back in contact with the blade. For the first, don't do it, and for the second, we have changed blades, and the belts, which seems to have reduced it to acceptable levels.

The Jointer was left running with no-one around. Again, don't do it.

Security

This month has seen a spate of doors being left open. At various times, the Henderson shed, the Main shed, and the Paint Shed have all been left open overnight. Luckily, nothing seems to have walked on those occasions, but we wont always be so lucky. Can Shed Managers make sure they do a final walk around please.

Facility Maintenance

It was good to see the Open Day at the beginning of the month spur a good cleanup of the sheds. There was also a pleasing attendance of members to assist with the set-up, manning and clean-up for the Open Days. Well done to all.

New Equipment

We have a set of Plano clamps currently in the Henderson shed for members to trial. They are meant to be used for anything you would normally think to use the scissors clamps for. Any jointing

of boards that you need to keep flat, such as table tops etc, they will be great for. Please see John Isles for detailed instructions. We intend to get that written up once they are accepted for use. Please give feedback to the Shed Managers if you find them useful.

Notes from Our Travelling President.



This is where the roads end and the canals start. The mode of transport here change from engines and wheels to outboard motors



This research station, managed by my daughter on behalf of a couple of Canadian universities, is where students from all over the world come to undertake their field surveys for data towards their PHDs in biology, ecology and the environment. The station can house up to 20 researchers. They also do lots of beach surveys as this area is "Green Turtle Central" for the world, with up to 20,00 nests along a 30 km stretch of shoreline.

In the eastern (Caribbean) side there are many swamps and canals, with few decent roads. Here in Tortuguero, this double or triple "tinny" is the main form of transport for supplies, tourists and taxis. Many are driven by 14 to 16 year old family members

Notice of a Blind Auction to be closed on 30th October 2024

In the early 1920s, Alf Smith was making and selling wooden toys at his **Fancy Goods Store.** This was one of Montville's first ventures into the tourist market. Fifty years later, the **Toymakers and Craft Centre**, was part of an Arts and Crafts boom that attracted tourists to Montville from all over. Owners, Paul and Sutira Sykes, renewed Montville's reputation for toymaking. Today, the **Blackall Range Woodcrafters Guild** (Woodies) make, sell and donate to charity 100s of wooden toys every year. Toymaking has been a part of Montville's creative history for over a century.

The Montville History Group (MHG) has been bequeathed a 4foot x 3foot metal sign advertising the **Toymakers and Craft Centre** in the 1970s. As the MHG does not have a museum function, it has decided to offer the sign for auction. It believes this sign could feature in a studio or workshop or be an historic feature on a wall of any of our older, historic houses, holiday rentals or tourist orientated businesses.

The MHG decided on a **Blind Auction**, because it believes that this way the market will determine the value of this historic piece of memorabilia. Interested bidders have until midnight on the 31st October to make a bid. All bids will remain confidential and the winning bid will be notified on 1st November.
