Shed Managers' Report

Pretty good month for gear maintenance, but a poor weather one.

Maintenance:

The significant items have been:

- The 'Rat' issue continued, with the Laguna Thicknesser (T2) once again under attack. Some baiting seems to have temporarily reduced the issue, but time will tell. We need the snakes back.
- The Bobbin Sander (S3) has had its disc paper changed. This was a bit of an issue, as the factory one was a stick-on. Now changed to a Velcro one.
- The bevel adjustments on both Woodman table saws (TS1) and (TS2) had to be re-adjusted. This seems to indicate that members are still forcing these adjustments beyond the stop point. Please, when you notice it hitting the stop, don't turn any more. We have already had one saw fail by this being forced and broken. We don't want a repeat.
- The Hammer Jointer/Thicknesser (J/T 1) had its cutters rotated. This was a satisfactory period for those cutters. Good to see.
- The Woodwiz has been in the wars a bit, with all cutters badly chipped, and the rotor showing signs of having contacted something metallic. Once again, it is not possible that the operator did not notice this. It would have made a big racket. No reports to shed captains though. Not good enough.

Safety/Security/Facilities

- Only security issue was one instance of the smoko stuff being left out overnight. Not really a big issue, but not great if we are trying to rid ourselves of rodents.
- Test and Tag was undertaken this period, with no major issues identified. Thanks Ted.

New Equipment

We continue the familiarization of members with the CNC. The first of the workshops has been held in the period, and was very well attended. A second one is being planned for those members who couldn't make the first one. It looks like having to be on a Saturday to suit most attendees, so might have to wait till after Easter and the Open Day. A few members have started to work through the Accreditation Process, and some others are working hard at the Fusion tutorials. Great to see.

Club Projects

No progress on the clean-up of the area to the immediate south of the Henderson Shed and Timber storage this month, as we are awaiting an end to the rain and hot muggy weather.

Rob Forsythe continues to work on the boxes and tables he is making for the Sunshine Coast Council libraries. He always appreciates some assistance, so if you are at a loose end, and want to learn some new skills, talk to Rob and give him a hand. We will be making the table tops on the CNC, so you might find that interesting as an example project.

We have had a number of requests over the month for Club Projects, but have responded in all cases that we are happy to help, but it will have to be in the second half of the year. So, the message is, if you are free, come along on a Thurs, we have plenty of interesting work ahead of us.




