Shed Managers' Report

A better month overall, with only two worrying items this month.

Maintenance:

The significant items have been:

The main thicknesser (T1) .has a major issue discovered this month. A
total of 15 cutters and associated bolts had been totally destroyed, and
virtually ground away. You cannot do that sort of damage without noticing
it. However, it was not reported at the time, just afterwards when members
noticed it wasn't cutting in the middle. The damage is unfortunate, not
reporting it is inexcusable.



 The Laguna bandsaw (B3) had a failure this month that was eventually traced to starter contacts in the motor. We tried repairs, but that was not successful, so a new motor was purchased, and is currently being modified to fit the saw. This issue was reported.

A couple more minor items for the month.

- The Jet Bandsaw broke a blade, and was replaced. (Reported)
- The drum sander (S5) was again in trouble, with a badly clogged paper. That was replaced, and it is now operational again. The handle is currently under repair. These items were also reported.
- We also have had a couple of reports of the Festool compound saw being very hard to pull down. We are currently trying to lubricate this problem.
- The CNC laser head is back in operation (thanks to a bit of troubleshooting from John Isles. It is good to see it getting a fair bit of use.

Safety/Security/Facilities

Better on this front. Still a few misses for Shed Captains though.

- Compressor left on.
- Lights in kitchen left on.
- Toilets left open.
- Main shed security bar left open.

Club Projects

Sheree has been working diligently on the rehabilitation project on the back of the shed and storage area. We will be calling for assistance shortly to assist with removal of privet trees. We are dumping sawdust now once a fortnight on the track delineated by Sherrie. Members are encouraged to go for a walk down there (accessible either from the smoko area, or from the milling stockpile area) and have a look at the intact vegetation down there. It is well worth the effort to clean it up and enjoy it.

Graham Bradford is nearing completion on the benches for the Maleny Hospital. We have had a good, but variable response to the notice for volunteers to help with this work.

Rob Forsyth has carried out some emergency repairs to the bench we re-made for Montville MVA, due to the curved back splitting. We will monitor that for future issues, but it may come up for replacement in the future.

We have a significant backlog of project work, but have delayed commencing it until the main bench project is out of the way. Please don't hesitate to get involved in those in coming months. See Rob F.


Around the Sheds
