# Shed Managers' Report

#### Maintenance:

The significant items have been:

- Replaced blade on Bandsaw B4.
- 2 x LED lights not working in lathe area. Need to investigate as to if they were repaired.
- Duster extractor bag on Wood Whiz found to be very full and needs to be checked before use. Recommended not more than 70% full before being emptied.
- Thicknesser T1 found to be leaving a small line on timber. Investigation found 3 cutters with chips. Cutters rotated and is now okay.
- Bandsaw B3 motor replaced. Overload switch fitted to this motor. Switch will need to be reset if it trips and reported.
- Blade raising and lowering mechanism on Table Saw TS2 was becoming was starting to become tighter. Dry film lube applied to worm gear and now appears to be fine.
- Bandsaw blade on B2 broke whilst in use (by me TW). Unsure as to why as I was only doing 70mm straight cuts on 400mm timber and turning off the machine each time prior to withdrawing timber.
- Airhose near Wadkins Bandsaw ruptured on Saturday. Needs to be repaired.

#### Safety/Security/Facilities

- Incident on Laguna bandsaw with kickback on roundish piece of timber with two flat faces. Timber shot up and out toward operator hitting him on the cheek and a thumb. Bleeding under thumb and very likely bruising on cheek. Member was using a parallel fence and pushblock. Incident report to be completed.
- Need to make a decision on type of first aid training to be offered to Shed Captains and others who are interested.
- With regard to electrical test & tag. I have had no joy in contacting Worksafe Qld regarding our test & tag requirements. They are making me feel a bit unloved. However I received an Information Bulletin from John Barletta of the Maleny Men's Shed put out by the Qld Men's Shed Association which pertains to volunteer organisations in Qld. The Information sheet is parked in My Files under the Test & Tag folder. It appears volunteer organisations "have no legislative duty in Qld to comply with test and tag requirements" It is however recommended that test and tag be carried out. The decisions we need to make are the time intervals between testing and if we test

double insulated equipment at the same time as non-double insulated equipment. My thoughts are double insulated equipment every 12 months and all other equipment every 6 months. This would seem to comply with the requirements of manufacturing workshops as detailed in the appropriate legislation. Interested to know people's thoughts.

• Further on the subject of test and tag, James McCormack, Woodies test and tag electrician, is not available until after 29 October and we are due for testing around 6 October. Given the latest information we have on test and tag we should be able to wait until then.

Blackall Range Woodcrafters Guild Inc has recently received some excellent support from Sunshine Coast Council by way of community grants.


